Dear Summit Academy - Toledo Families:

I want to thank you and your children personally for the sacrifices, support, and commitments you have made to continue the education process during this difficult period. I also want to express my gratitude to you for sharing your input in our recent survey regarding education delivery for our upcoming third quarter (Q3). Thirty-seven Summit Academy - Toledo families took the survey. For your reference, I am attaching a summary of the survey results at the bottom of this letter.

Our Summit Academy school principals looked at your interests as well as COVID-19 trends and safety guidelines from health agencies in the decision-making process for Q3, which runs January 5 to March 11, 2021. Similar to what is currently provided, Summit Academy - Toledo, when permitted by Lucas County, will provide students a combination of remote and in-person learning for Q3. Toledo families will have the option to select full-time remote learning for their children as well. An important note: Summit Academy - Toledo will be fully remote for all students, K-12, until January 18, 2021. Students will return to the building on January 19. This decision was made to limit possible virus exposure from holiday travel.

Protecting our students, families, and staff remains a top priority. We will continue to follow local, county, and state health department guidelines throughout the pandemic. We will also soon begin planning for our fourth quarter and will notify you of Q4 plans by February 26, 2021. A Q4 survey will be part of that process. We value your input and hope you will participate in that future survey. In the meantime, and as promised, here is a summary of results received from Summit Academy - Toledo parents/guardians and school staff and administrators from the Q3 survey:
